State prerequisites: Must be at least 18 years of age or legally emancipated, reside in or have a regular place of work or business in North Carolina, have a high school diploma or equivalent, and be able to speak, read, and write the English language. No felony conviction or civil judgment. Reside legally in the United States. Required textbook (North Carolina Notary Public Manual, 2016) is available in the college bookstore and must be purchased before entering the Notary Public class. Additional costs include: textbook, commission fee, seal, oath of office, and a Notary Public Record Book.

Adult High School (AHS) and High School Equivalency (HSE)

If you would like to earn your Adult High School Diploma or High School Equivalency Diploma, please attend one of our FREE Student Success Classes:

Adult High School (AHS) – ONLINE

To enroll in the Adult High School (AHS) Diploma Program, you must attend an Adult High School Student Success Class (SSC) online. There will be at least two opportunities per month to attend one of the classes via Zoom. You may choose a morning or evening SSC. Students will receive academic counseling and further information about the program. Applicants will need to use a computer with webcam and need a strong internet connection for SSC.

Classes will begin immediately following successful completion of SSC. Classes are available 24/7 for all registered students, with end of semester breaks in June and December.

Online orientations are by reservation by filling out the contact form that can be accessed at the Adult High School page on *gaston.edu*. Students will need to provide the following items to attend the AHS Student Success Class:

1. VALID driver's license, ID or any government–issued photo ID.

- 2. Social Security or Tax Identification.
- Unopened, official transcript from the last school attended, brought in person or mailed to: Debra Hissom, 201 Hwy 321 S, Dallas, NC 28034. Your last school may send transcripts electronically to Admissions. Transcripts will be evaluated to determine credits that may be transferred to the AHS Program.

If you are 16 or 17 years old, you will need to provide completed Minor Paperwork, along with the above three documents. The Minor Paperwork Packet may be picked up at the Life Skills office on the Dallas and Lincoln campuses or can be accessed on the AHS web page or requested via email.

High School Equivalency (HSE) (formerly known as GED[®]) – CLASSROOM and ONLINE

To enroll in the High School Equivalency Program, students must attend the Basic Skills Student Success (BSSS) Class. Some of the topics covered in class are: the steps to earning your HSE, the HSE Scholarship, conflict resolution, study skills, basic career assessment, placement testing, and assignment to appropriate classes.

Two forms of identification are required to enroll:

- 1. Valid state driver's license or ID or government ID.
- 2. Social Security Card

Additionally, students who are **16 and 17 years old** will need to provide Minor Paperwork, along with the above two documents. The Minor Paperwork Packet is provided by the Life Skills office on the Dallas and Lincoln campuses. The HSE Student Success Class is held
